


































JUDIT ÁGNES KISS



SHONA INNES

"I think what I love best is providing a family a way of putting a trouble into words so that it can be shared and worked through."

Shona is known for supporting troubled children, young people and their carers, and collaborating with support and protection agencies to address the challenging behaviours that result from complex and criminal situations. And she accidentally wrote some children's books....

Some letters, notes and badly drawn pictures that Shona posted off to the children she had seen in sessions have been turned into beautiful picture books, illustrated by Írisz Agócs. The series have made their way around the world. The series has been translated into multiple languages; French, Dutch, Chinese, Romanian, Danish, Hungarian, Persian and Japanese.

The titles deal with emotive issues that children face in direct and gentle terms, allowing children's feelings and problems to be more easily shared and discussed with family and friends, gently talk about topics that many find emotional. Each of the stories has grown from psychological sessions with children (and sometimes with grown ups) to help them understand and talk about complex emotional situations in simple and gentle ways.

Today, more than 40 of her titles have been published. Her work as a storybook author is unique in the way her books have appealed to and captivated children of all ages, from the youngest to the teenage. Her books have sold in tens of thousands of copies, and her most popular characters have been brought to life in summer camps, workshops, themed playgrounds, theatre performances and cartoons. Berg's stories teach without being intrusive, setting an example for young readers while being both funny and cool.

Her works have been translated into English and German, Italian, Serbian, Russian, Dutch, Polish, Swedish, Czech, Romanian and Chinese.

Besides state rewards she won the Hungarian IBBY prize twice (2007 and 2020), now she works as the president of the organization as well.
