The unique visual design of his work matches surreal narratives, but his stories are always easy to digest and touch the deep core of his audience.

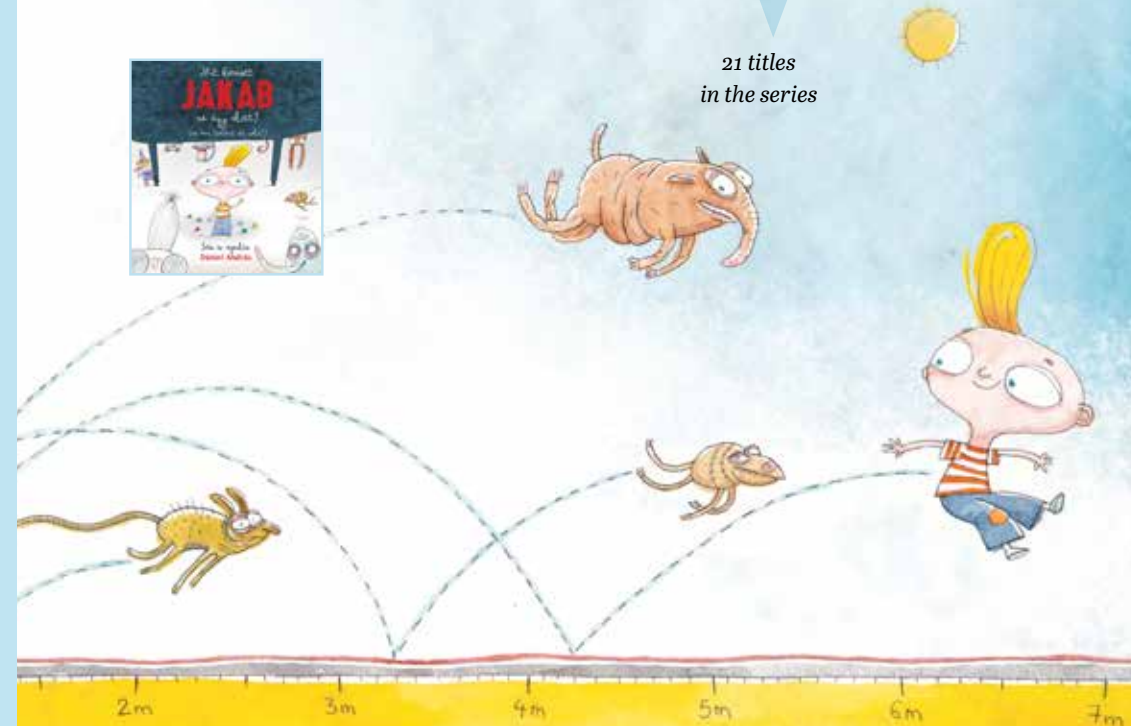

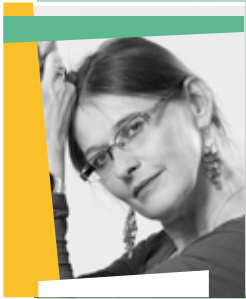

She has gathered thousands of followers on social media, influencing them to discover the joy of art daily.

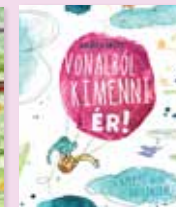

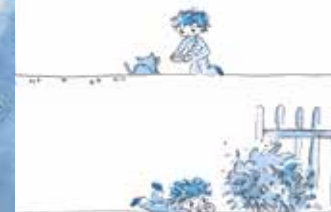
Kata Fodor's beautiful picture book tells the story of waiting for a child to older siblings or new parents with full-page, delicate watercolors and short, poetic text.
